## 3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCES

- locking and securing of building sites and work areas as well as in case of accidents
- installation of traffic signs and traffic facilities
- examination of the condition of roads, parking places, bicycle lanes and footpaths as well as bridges
- performance of construction and maintenance measures on roads and road structures
- ability to make drainage systems and similar facilities
- design and maintenance of green areas
- planting, care and examination of shrubs and trees
- collection of weather information for winter service as well as evaluation and introduction of necessary measures by using IT, datasheets and according to local situation
- cooperation in the clearing of snow and spreading of grit including the preparation of salt and brine mixtures
- maintenance, servicing and repair of vehicles, attachments and accessories, and machinery
- appropriate written and oral command of language and specialist terminology as well as use of job-related foreign language

## 4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE<sup>(3)</sup>

### Range of occupations:

Employment in road and motorway maintenance areas, building yards, construction companies, civil engineering companies and other related branches (such as landscape gardening or snow clearing firms) in the public service of road construction authorities (such as corresponding departments of cities, municipalities or the federal government) etc.

### Pursuit of regulated professions on a self-employed basis:

Qualifications pursuant to the 1994 *Gewerbeordnung* (Crafts, Trade and Industry Act): The crafts and trades regulated on the basis of the Crafts, Trade and Industry Act are subject to the provisions contained in the ordinances on the certificates of competence regarding the furnishing of certificates of competence for the self-employed exercising of a craft or trade. Final apprenticeship examinations that have been completed successfully shall replace, in particular, those parts of the master craftsperson examination which refer to subject-specific skills and knowledge related to the various crafts and trades.

<b>6. OFFICIALLY RECOGNISED WAYS OF ACQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE</b>
<p>1. Training within the framework of the given Road Servicing Specialist Training Regulation and of the curriculum of the vocational school for apprentices. Admission to the final apprenticeship examination upon completion of the apprenticeship period specified for the apprenticeship trade concerned. The final apprenticeship examination aims to establish whether the apprentice has acquired the skills and competences required for the respective apprenticeship trade and is able to carry out the activities particular to the learned trade herself/himself in an appropriate manner.</p> <p>2. Admission to the final apprenticeship examination in accordance with Article 23 (5) of the <i>Berufsausbildungsgesetz</i> (Vocational Training Act). An applicant for an examination is entitled to sit the final apprenticeship examination without completing a formal apprenticeship training if she/he has reached 18 years of age and is able to prove acquisition of the required skills and competences by means of a relevant practical or an on-the-job training activity of appropriate length, by attending relevant courses etc.</p>
<p><b>Additional information:</b></p> <p><b>Entry requirements:</b> successful completion of 9 years of compulsory schooling</p> <p><b>Duration of training:</b> 3 years</p> <p><b>Enterprise-based training:</b> Enterprise-based training comprises <math>\frac{4}{5}</math> of the entire duration of the training and focuses on the provision of job-specific skills and competences according to Article 3 of the Training Regulation, BGBl. II (Federal Law Gazette) No. 145/11, enabling the apprentice to exercise qualified activities as defined by the profile of skills and competences specified above.</p> <p><b>Education at vocational school:</b> School-based education comprises <math>\frac{1}{5}</math> of the entire duration of the training.
