Additional information

Entry requirements: successful completion of school year 8, if necessary entry examination.

Duration of education: 5 years

Duration of compulsory work placement: work placement 32 weeks in all during holidays.

Education goals: Intensive five-year vocational education in general educational, technical practical, tourism-economic and business subjects. Imparting knowledge and skills that qualify students for advanced professions in the economy, particularly in the area of the tourism and leisure industry as well as entry to a university. Important goals are professional and social competence, personality development, ability to be vocationally mobile and flexible, criticism, self responsibility, social engagement, creativity, ability to work in a team, ability to communicate in the instruction language and foreign languages, readiness to permanent further education.
